

## NC State Health Director's Statewide Standing Order to Allow Pharmacists to Dispense Over the Counter At-Home COVID-19 Tests January 14th, 2022

This standing order authorizes any North Carolina licensed pharmacist, in accordance with the conditions of their licensure, to dispense any over-the-counter (OTC) at-home COVID-19 test made available under an FDA emergency use authorization (FDA authorized) or FDA approval (FDA approved) to persons without an individual prescription. This order is in no way intended to authorize a healthcare provider to practice outside their legally defined scope of practice. Insurance coverage and dispensing limits of at-home test kits will vary based on policies of insurance plans.

Assessment Criteria		
Eligibility Criteria	Patient, parent/legal guardian on behalf of patient, or patient's designated representative attests that the patient meets the criteria for use of FDA-authorized or FDA-approved at-home OTC COVID-19 test of the specific at-home COVID-19 they have selected. Plan of Care		
Actions	1. Data Collection  a. If patient is covered by Medicaid, pharmacist will collect patient's NC Medicaid information, according to site protocol, in order to bill Medicaid for the patient's selected FDA-authorized or FDA-approved over-the-counter COVID-19 at-home test.  b. Pharmacist will collect patient information for other payers according to other payors' protocol and coverage policies.  2. Patient Instruction  a. Prior to dispensing at home testing kit, the pharmacist shall direct patient to review the manufacturer's instructions for use. The instructions for use of each COVID-19 at-home test may be found in the box or at the following web sites:  i. Fact Sheets and Instructions for Use for Individuals for molecular COVID-19 tests  ii. Fact Sheets and Instructions for Use for Individuals for antigen COVID-19 tests  b. The pharmacist may also provide anticipatory guidance depending on the patient's need, to the patient, patient's legal	

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	guardian/parent, or patient's designated representative regarding:
	i. Where, how, and when to obtain the test result;
	ii. DHHS At-Home Testing Guidance for the General Public
	iii. Information on control measures to follow while waiting
	for the test result and to follow if the test result is positive,
	based on Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
	(CDC) guidance;
	iv. Direct patient to notify their primary care doctor or
	advanced practice provider (nurse practitioner, certified
	nurse-midwife, or physician assistant) if they have
	additional questions about the use of their FDA-authorized
	or FDA-approved over-the-counter at-home COVID-19
	test.
	v. Provide patient information on how to access medical care
	if the patient has or develops worsening symptoms.
<b>Contraindications for</b>	There are no specific contraindications for dispension of at-home COVID-19
